Promote the Health: Dynamic Forest Restoration

CONCERN: Other areas disturbed by past timber harvests now have a dense matrix of diseased beech brush, crowding out the forest floor.

• The beech brush will not mature to produce nesting places for birds or nuts for mammals.

IMPACT: Natural forest regeneration has not occurred, with valuable seed trees in decline.

Reducing the forest's value as a wildlife habitat.

ACTION: We are a working on a multi-year Dynamic Forest Restoration (DFR) project to improve overall forest diversity and health.

- 60 acres completed in 2023 on Shaffer's Knob.
- 70 acres scheduled in 2024 on Chestnut Mt.
- Funding provided by grants from the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation.
